



INTERNET USERS AGREEMENT

1. Users must read and abide by the Internet Use Policy and acknowledge intent to comply by clicking on "I Accept" at the bottom of this page.
2. Two people may work together at one computer if they are not disturbing others or impeding the use of other workstations in designated areas of the library.
3. User will not engage in any unlawful activity, including the transmission of any material in violation of any U.S. or state regulation.
4. Users will not seek to gain unauthorized access to the resources of the library or Internet databases.
5. Users will not disrupt the privacy of any users.
6. Users will observe all copyright laws which might apply to files, software, or other resources downloaded from the Internet.
7. Users may not engage in any activity that can be construed to be harmful to minors in any way.
8. Users assume responsibility for the sites selected to view on the Internet.
9. Users understand that information obtained from the Internet is used "at your own risk" and that the library makes no guarantee as to accuracy or validity of information obtained, displayed or printed from Internet.
10. The City of Puyallup and the library staff and Board assume no responsibility for any direct or indirect, consequential, special or punitive damages or losses, arising from use of its personal computers, World Wide Web server, or from its connections to other Internet services
11. It is prohibited to:
 - Edit or alter systems files;
 - Use any Puyallup Public Library computer to crack or hack the library's automated circulation/catalog files or system or those of any other computer system or file;
 - Engage in any activity, which purposely seeks to gain unauthorized access to the resources on the Internet, disrupts the intended use of the Internet, wastes resources through such action, or destroys the integrity of computer-based information;
 - Knowingly introduce a virus into the library's automated circulation/catalog system or any other computer system;
 - Use any Puyallup Public Library computer for illegal or criminal purposes, including obscenity and child pornography;
 - Obstruct other people's work by deliberately crashing or tying up any computer;
 - Read or attempt to read another person's electronic mail or other protected files or compromise the privacy of users.
