

Keep Lanes of Travel Clear

Each year, over one million people visit the city for the Puyallup Fair. There are more travelers on our sidewalks and roads than any other time of the year. You can help reduce the risk of accidents by keeping streets and sidewalks clear.

To ensure public safety, vehicles obstructing or overhanging sidewalks will be towed. Objects blocking streets or sidewalks will be removed or relocated.

Cones and Objects in the Right of Way



Cones and other objects blocking public right of way or reserving on-street parking will be removed.

Flagger Safety

Waving down cars? These important tips will help everyone stay safe:

1. Wear a safety vest for visibility.
2. Go bright at night: be sure your vest includes reflectors and use a flashlight so cars can spot you easily.
3. Keep the street clear for vehicle traffic. Do not stand in the lane of travel to flag vehicles onto your lot.



Curbs & Sidewalks

With a million visitors coming to town, the city works hard to keep Puyallup looking good. Street sweepers run frequently near the fair, and boards/ramps can damage these machines. Please remove ramps and boards from the roadway when you are done parking for the day. Remember, property owners are responsible for damage to sidewalks or curbs caused by parking cars.

Maintaining a Safe Sight Distance*

Intersection visibility is key to keeping everyone safe, particularly during the Puyallup Fair. Maintaining a safe sight distance at intersections is one way to limit the risk of accidents and protect city residents and visitors from injury.

The diagrams below illustrate how you can identify the “Triangular Sight Area” on your property. This area is crucial for ensuring sufficient and safe sight distance at an intersection.


Anything located within the Triangular Sight Area must not be more than three (3) feet in

height. Vehicles, large signs, or other items that exceed the height limit should not be placed within the sight area.

City staff may contact property owners or remove hazards if they find there is insufficient sight distance at an intersection.

Large signs, vehicles, or other items taller than three feet should not be placed in the “Triangular Sight Area” (the shaded area) in order to maintain a safe sight distance.



You can estimate the “Triangular Sight Area” on your property by measuring 25 feet in either direction along the straight portion of the curb.
